You may remember that in April we visited Florence visited. She was planning to move to Dubai to earn money for her very poor family.

Fortunately, we were able to stop her, because the golden mountains promised there in Dubai are, of course, fairy tales. When we talked further with her, she also turned out to be pregnant. So what do you do do as a foundation? In consultation with her sponsor of course, we didn't let the family down and ensured that they can at least support themselves. can provide for themselves.

Together with our collaborator in Uganda, we arranged for Florence to buy a simple baby kit. In July she gave birth of a beautiful son; they are both doing well. This year Florence will stay at home to take care of her son care. Next year, with the (financial) help of her sponsor to train as a seamstress so that she can then earn her own living support. Of course, we will continue to keep Florence and her family closely and where necessary we will assist.

### Projects in Lwengo

Our foundation aims to give children from poor families the chance of an education. In addition we are constantly looking for sponsors for projects in the community that are related to the children.

This year we have already achieved a lot with the help of major sponsors. We give a brief update. SCHOOL | Through Knowledge For Children, a Dutch foundation active in Africa, we have

been able to arrange large numbers of school books. The teachers and pupils are extremely happy with the new materials (see the photo on page 1). new Furthermore the classroom for ICT education is ready. A teacher has been teacher has been recruited and lessons have started. The school grounds were in poor condition, but are now fully paved. No more mud in the classrooms and on the verandas. Also for disabled children and elderly/parents it is now a safe flat surface. Further flower boxes in which vegetables are grown. All classrooms have been given a new floor. For the smallest children we have had made-to-measure furniture and each class has received a bookcase. The grounds have also been made made with a fence and surveillance cameras. Two new classrooms are being built for the older primary school pupils. This creates space for separate classrooms for deaf pupils. We want to keep deaf children within the school community and expect to attract more deaf pupils.

HEALTH CENTER | We have realised an extension of the medical centre, which now also allows deliveries can take place. Sufficient beds and equipment available. In addition offer dental care through sponsorship to children and adults. A dentist will visit periodically.

FAMILY HOME | The Family Home is almost ready and will be during the summer holidays (December and January) accommodate children without a home. Here they get a bed and proper care.

HOUSING | There are still challenges, such as the lack of living space for teachers and staff of the health centre. This is increasingly becoming a necessary condition of employment.
